One of the events which we have had to cancel due to the coronavirus was a fund-raising event last Saturday afternoon. The plan was to wash cars and sell cakes to raise money for Alice to have a piece of equipment that has been recommended by health professionals to reduce the possibility of SUDEP (Sudden unexpected death in epilepsy). Pulse Guard is a small monitor that alerts you to a sudden rise or fall in heart rate while sleeping and this may indicate that the person is having a seizure which may require immediate attention. This would be of great benefit to Lindsay as she cares for her. It will also mean that Lindsay could get a good night sleep!
