

## A Book Review from Mike Edmondson:

'Resilience in Life and Faith' (Finding your strength in God) by Tony Horsfall & Debbie Hawker



This book was promoted when Debbie Hawker spoke at St Stephen's several months ago. She writes as a clinical psychologist and along with her husband supports cross-cultural workers and their families around the world. This book intersperses case studies of Biblical characters such as Elijah and Nehemiah, with chapters looking at matters such as 'Spiritual aspects of resilience' and 'Social and systematic aspects of resilience.' There is an academic substance to the book but presented in a very practical and easy to understand way. Highly recommended, especially to those who are 'struggling' in these 'unprecedented times'. Primarily meant for Christians, those who are not unsympathetic might also derive a benefit from reading the book.

A free phone line of hymns, reflections and prayers

A wonderful initiative, especially for those not on the internet.

Those who phone Daily Hope will first hear a greeting from Archbishop Welby before being offered a range of prayers, hymns, and liturgy, including the Church of England's weekly national online service, and advice about the coronavirus.

Options available include materials also made available digitally by the Church of England's Communications team such as Prayer During the Day and Night Prayer, updated daily, from Common Worship, and a recording of the Church of England online service.

A section called Hymn Line offers callers a small selection of hymns, updated daily. An option entitled 'Hymns We Love' provides a hymn and reflection.
