
### Church Without Walls

#### A new series for Sunday morning

We are going to be starting a new series on Sunday morning looking at Peter's first letter. This Sunday we are focusing on how Jesus forgave and reaffirmed Peter as a leader and it's a reminder that God is always ready to give us a second chance when we mess up! But the following Sunday we start our new series. The letter has a lot to teach us about being 'Church' in the midst of a pandemic. Peter wrote this letter to this first century church and describes them as 'God's elect, exiles, scattered throughout the provinces...' (1 Peter 1 v 1) and we are experiencing what it means

to be the 'scattered people of God' and we too need to be reminded of our calling and the purpose which God has for the church and for our lives. So I am looking forward to us looking at this book together and as I share the teaching with others I am full of expectancy for all we will learn together. This morning I read through the whole letter – it isn't very long and it's a good way to prepare and listen to what God has to say to us at this time.

#### Is church going to be open for private prayer?

You may have seen on the news that the Government is allowing churches and other religious buildings to open for private prayer. This is with the provision that directions regarding social distancing and cleaning are followed. In fact, we have a long list of instructions from the Diocese and we will make sure that we follow these to reduce any potential risk of spreading the virus. This week PCC decided that we would open church for private prayer in early July and it will probably be open on two mornings

during the week and for one afternoon over the weekend. We think it is important to show that the church is open and offer the opportunity for people, who perhaps normally wouldn't come into church to come and pray. Church family are also welcome to come for private prayer and we hope you will. More details to follow.
