# "When I was hungry...": Feeding Indian Christians in Covid-19 crisis

Christians in India are often last in line for essential food

and aid because of their faith, and this is on top of the persecution



they already face for following Jesus.

When India went into lockdown to combat Covid-19, hundreds of thousands of people lost their jobs overnight. Many of these usually work as daily labourers and earn each day what they need to survive: without the day's income, they have no money to buy food. Official aid isn't anywhere near enough for the number of people who need it, and Christians are often deliberately overlooked when this aid is distributed. India is just one place among many where Christians are persecuted for their faith. Our brothers and sisters need our prayers.

For God's protection for Christians who are being denied essential food and aid. For protection for Christian aid agencies working to provide food and aid, and that they would be able to reach those most in need, at
