8/Remember to be alert. Britain needs lerts.



Social media 'a great opportunity' to spread God's word

A Bible translation team in Senegal and The Gambia is using social media to spread the good news of Jesus among the Karon people. As well as translating the Scriptures into the Karon language, the team, which includes people serving with Wycliffe Bible Translators, is using Facebook and WhatsApp to give Karon users access to portions of the Bible.

David Lowry, who serves with Wycliffe on the Karon team, says: 'Making the Scriptures available to people from minority language groups in their own language is an important way of helping them to understand and engage with God's word. With so many people in Africa having smartphones, making use of social media is an easy, rapid and efficient way of spreading the good news of Jesus.

As a related development, Matthias (one of the translation team) recently started a Sunday afternoon radio show in The Gambia. His idea is to tie in the radio show to the social media groups, as well as livestream the radio broadcast on the Facebook page. The radio show plays a section of Karon Scripture each week, followed by an exposition of the passage and a panel discussion where listeners can call in.

David sums this up: 'In Africa, as in the rest of the world, people are more and more linked in to the brave new world of "online". Their thoughts are filled with WhatsApp discussion, friends' Facebook posts, sharing the latest video etc. We need to bring the gospel into this world, and the fact that we can do it with audio-visual Bible resources in people's own local languages is a great opportunity!'






A free phone line of hymns, reflections and prayers
