Responding to a request for help and a Bishop's talk

Some of our church family attended the online Diocesan Conference a couple of weeks ago. One person was moved by this to respond to a request for help:

A couple of weeks ago I had a request from Jacqui Bimson who leads Bethel Church in Preston with her husband. They are helping and supporting the 'working girls' in Preston by going out on the streets on a Saturday evening and getting to know them. They are in the process of buying a home to house some of them.

They are asking for donations of certain items to help them out: these are:

underwear, wet wipes, deodorant, water, hats, gloves, scarves, umbrellas, food -e.g crisps, biscuits, things they can eat quickly. Jacqui says that one of them is 'on fire for Jesus' and several others are new Christians.

After listening to Bishop Jill talking about fire and an underground army of folk who are poor, broken-hearted, prisoners etc, I wanted to ask Church members if they would be willing to help by donating some of these items.

There will be a box in church until the end of November for any of the above items.

Cedar House is limited to online counselling at the moment, due to some staff testing positive for Covid 19. This doesn't work for some clients, so they have asked us to pray:

- For God's protection over Cedar House and all the team.
- For healing for those who are suffering now from Covid or its after-effects
- For clients left high and dry again
- For the many local people who are desperate for counselling but can't get help
- For wisdom and guidance for the trustees as we make decisions about the way ahead
- A client not a Christian has asked for prayer for his carer Wendy, who has just been diagnosed with breast cancer. He asked for us to get as many people as possible to pray.
