

An Open Letter on
Behalf of UK Christian
Event Leaders

A letter has been sent to all Christians from the leaders a number of large Christian events:

Christian events in the UK have a legacy that has impacted millions, and that legacy is refreshed year on year as more come to faith and respond to God's work in their lives. Christian events create space for us to come away from the day-to-day routine and for God to impact us.

But now, the Covid-Pandemic has had a profound impact on us all both practically and financially.

As we contemplate two years without gathering in the normal way, we have had to rapidly learn to meet in new ways – either online or in smaller hybrid events.

Some of these events have been postponed, some have moved to free digital alternatives, some to chargeable digital or hybrid events. Each event has had to take the decision that is best for them both now and for running events in future.

Now they need our prayerful and practical support. They need people to stand with them financially, and to support them in any way we can so that we can all gather again in 2022.

Bethany House News

Unfortunately we have an outbreak of Coronavirus at Bethany House.

Out of 22 residents, 17 have had positive tests although 3 of those are waiting for confirmation by the lab test. 5 residents have continued to test negative and today no new positive cases were identified, so the lockdown to rooms, which has been in process since last Friday, is taking effect.

Two staff tested positive this week and have mild symptoms, although both had been vaccinated with the first dose. No new cases today among staff.

We are thankful to God for his protection as we have no poorly residents but some have some minor symptoms.

Prayer points from Gill the Home manager:

- no further positive tests amongst residents
- residents to stay well
- no further cases amongst staff and protection for them and their families
- positive staff to stay well and cope with isolating with their families
- wellbeing of residents in isolation, some are struggling with this.
- Energy levels for staff, as they face very busy and demanding working days.

Please pray for Gill as she seeks to encourage the staff and residents, as she and the Care Managers keep resident relatives and friends informed. That she will know Gods presence especially in the night that she might have restful sleep.
